



# **VdGM Junior Researcher Award**

As adopted by the Europe Council in Malaga (2010)

#### Junior Researcher Award



#### What purpose?

- General practice (GP) and Family Medicine (FM) is known to be an emerging field for research activities all over the world
- It's comprehensive, population based scope implies special demands for multimethodological research skills
- VdGM aims to promote a generation of junior GP/FM doctors who include research skills with patient care as a life time career
- VdGM therefore provides an annual junior researcher award
- This award honors outstanding research and researchers careers who are GP/FM trainees or junior GP/FM with up to 5 years working experience after graduation

### Who can apply?

- GP/FM trainees, junior GP/FMs (up to 5 years after graduation from vocational training)
- Finished research project with an impact on the field of general practice
- One publication per candidate is accepted
- Every VdGM national representative can propose one researcher for his/her country, using the selection grid as proposed by VdGM (annexe)

- Liaison person Research Theme group as representative of the VdGM EG
- Another member of the Research Theme group
- A member of EGPRN
- 2 external guest members as appointed by VdGM (senior researchers with experience)

#### Junior Researcher Award



#### Practical considerations

Application only through VdGM national representatives (Europe council members)

- Documents to be sent:
  - 1. a copy of passport or identity card
  - 2. a copy of student registration or document of graduation
  - 3. a short letter of presentation from the candidate (max 500 words)
  - 4. the national grid as filled out by the national representative or person responsible for national selection
  - 5. a copy of the research project as submitted by the candidate
- Deadline for application to the national representatives is 31<sup>st</sup> January, deadline for the proposal of the national candidate is 31st March prior to the WONCA Europe conference.
- Jury will define 3 final candidates before July 1st
- 3 final candidates will be invited to present their project during a VdGM workshop in the main conference (junior champions in GP-research).
- The final winner(s) (maximum 2 per year) will be pronounced during this workshop.
- 2000€ (two thousand) will be given to the winner (1000€ in case there are two winners)

The winner will allow VdGM to publish CV, portrait photography and research abstract on the VdGM website as examples of <u>Champions of Research</u> as general practice clinicians.
